



EFF STATEMENT ON POSTPONEMENT OF COMMON ASSAULT CASE AGAINST CIC JULIUS MALEMA

Wednesday, 10 March 2021

The EFF notes the postponement of the common assault case against the CIC Julius Malema and Commissar Dr Mbuyiseni Ndlozi to the 1st of July 2021.

As an organization, we are of the view that the proceedings of the last few days have proven that this is a frivolous case, concocted by right-wingers to distract the EFF leadership from the program of economic freedom.

There is no verifiable or reliable evidence that points to the fact that the leadership of the EFF acted unlawfully, when the racist Apartheid police man Johannes Venter tried to stop them from burying Mama Winnie Madikizela-Mandela.

More pointedly, there has been no exhibition that there was a reasonable cause to stop the CIC and Commissar Ndlozi from entering the cemetery, as they had been accredited and were allowed entry by a senior official of law enforcement after a racist inexplicably harassed the leadership of the EFF.

The entire case seems to be formulated to waste the time of state resources and keep the leadership of the EFF preoccupied with nonsense and not matters of national importance both at an organizational and legislative level.

The postponement is noted as part of a continued waste of the time of the judiciary whose time could be better spent solving real crimes.

We reiterate that the agenda of land expropriation without compensation and economic freedom will never be disturbed by frivolous cases cooked by racists, whose egos are hurt and privilege is threatened by the existence of the EFF.
