Today, in Ward 62 of Atteridgeville, two individuals were apprehended in the act of removing EFF posters, and they have been handed over to the police, with a case duly opened.

This despicable act is a clear attempt to stifle the voice of the people and suppress the message of economic freedom and social justice that the EFF stands for. We will, therefore, spare no effort in uncovering the culprits behind this attack on our democratic rights, which is not the first incident of this manner.

These cowardly acts are a testament to the fear instilled in our detractors by the growing influence of the EFF and the imminent threat we pose to their vested interests. We call on all fighters to remain vigilant and report any incidents of poster removal to the authorities immediately.

We also remind all fighters and supporters of the EFF to remain steadfast in the face of intimidation and attempts to silence our voice. The EFF is here to stay, and we will not be deterred in our mission to bring about economic freedom in our lifetime.
