



EFF STATEMENT ON SUCCESSFUL LIST CONFERENCE

The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) held its List Conference at the Durban Exhibition Centre on the 11th and 12th of February 2024. The List Conference, which was attended by 1,200 representatives from across all regions and provinces, was held to nominate candidates for Parliament and Provincial Legislatures seats, who will occupy positions in governance and lead South Africa after the National and Provincial Elections.

The EFF List Conference follows on the heels of our hugely successful Elections Manifesto Rally held at a full Moses Mabhida stadium, where the Commander-in-Chief, Julius Malema, presented a clear and comprehensive vision for our nation's future.

He touched on key sectors, outlining concrete plans to fix the economy, create jobs, return the land, and finally end the crippling load shedding that plagues our people. The CIC's message resonated deeply, offering hope and a roadmap for a brighter future.

The people of South Africa ought to know that through its List Conference, the EFF intends to provide the crème of the crop from within its ranks, and has set strict guidelines for those who either seek to return to Parliament and Legislatures, or those who have been nominated to prospectively lead South Africa into the future.

The criteria includes that the EFF Lists must have a contingent of 40% of its candidates being the youth, and 50% or more of its candidates on all lists being women.

Further to this, the meritocracy based deployment of the EFF requires that those who are nominated hold a matric certificate, that a minimum of ten (10) candidates to Parliament ought to hold PhD's, that amongst the nominated candidates there must be holders of post-matric qualifications and that the EFF list must be representative of the demographics of South Africa, and considerate of geographical spread.

As we move forward, we urge all ground forces to intensify the "umntu emntwini/motho mothong" elections campaign. Let us carry the message of hope and change to every corner of South Africa, mobilising our communities and ensuring a resounding victory for the EFF in the upcoming elections.

Furthermore, the EFF will be holding Provincial Manifesto Rallies in the remaining eight provinces of South Africa. These rallies will provide a platform to engage with our people, answer their questions, and further elaborate on our plans for each region and province of South Africa, as the EFF is a national organisation.
