



EFF STATEMENT DEMANDING MEAT INDUSTRY TO CEASE PURCHASES FROM RACIST KWAMAKALANE FARM IN LIMPOPO

Friday, 30 August

The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) demands that all buyers in the meat industry immediately cease purchasing from Kwamakalane farm where the horrific and inhumane act of feeding two black women to pigs occurred. These owners of this farm, located in Sebayeng outside Mankweng in Polokwane, have not only committed an unspeakable atrocity but have also created a significant public health risk.

On the 17th of August 2024, two women, 47-year-old Maria Makgato and 34-year-old Locadia Ndlovu, were brutally murdered by two white farmers in a heinous act of racist violence. The perpetrators, including farmer Zachariah Oliver and his two accomplices Adriaan De Wet and William Musoro, then fed the bodies of these women to their pigs. The pigs, having been fed human remains, now pose a danger to consumers, and any products derived from this farm must be removed from shelves without delay.

The EFF cannot stand by while products from this farm continue to be sold, risking the health and safety of our people. We call on all retailers and distributors to act responsibly and immediately sever ties with this farm, ensuring that no products from this source remain in circulation. Failure to do so will force in the EFF to assist in removing these products of their shelves.

In Limpopo, the EFF is working tirelessly to support the families affected by this tragedy, ensuring that they receive justice. The EFF is committed to holding those responsible accountable, and we will not rest until the community is free from the terror and danger posed by this farm and its practices.
